

Brother Martin High School Students' Dress Code 2010-2011

(Graduation) – Dress is a shirt and tie, **dark solid colored dress slacks** and dress shoes and socks under your cap and gown.

(Mother/Son Liturgy and Brunch) - – Dress is a shirt, tie, dress slacks, dress shoes, and socks.

(Ring Liturgy, Graduation Liturgy, Homecoming, Leadership Celebration, Ring Dance, Semi-formal Dances) - Dress is coat, dress shirt, tie, dress slacks, dress shoes, and socks.

(Prom) - Dress is a conservative tuxedo (white, black, gray, or dark blue) with dress shoes and dark socks. Tuxedos may have tails. Top hats and canes are allowed.

(Casual Dances, FISH Camp, Senior Sader Fun in the Sun Day, Retreats, Father/Son Crawfish Boil, Promfest) – Dress is a neat collared shirt or T-shirt. Any printing or embellishments on your shirt must be of an appropriate nature. Your shoulders must be covered; therefore, you may not wear muscle shirts or tank tops. You may wear casual pants, shorts, or neat jeans. Your shorts must be of an appropriate length. Running shorts or workout shorts are not permitted. Your clothing must fit. Oversized shirts or pants are not permitted. Your pants must be worn at an appropriate level to the waist. Pants that are hanging too low or exposing any portion of your underwear are not permitted. You may wear casual shoes and socks or tennis shoes and socks.

(Senior Parent Meeting, Senior Appreciation Dinner) - Dress is dress slacks, a collared shirt, dress shoes, and socks. **Seniors must be in full compliance with the grooming and uniform policy.**

Girls' Dress

(Prom) – Dress is formal. **Dresses must be long, floor length.** Dresses must not have immodest low necklines or visible midriffs. Girls must wear dress shoes, not casual sandals, tennis shoes, boots, or slippers. Jackets, sweaters or other garments may not be used to cover a dress which is inappropriate. No pierced body parts are to be visible except the ear lobes. No tattoos are to be visible.

(Homecoming, Ring Dance, Semi-formal Dances) – Dress is a semi-formal dress that is either long or short. Hemlines and slits in dresses must be no shorter than 4 inches above the knee. Dresses must not have immodest low necklines or visible midriffs. Girls must wear dress shoes, not casual sandals, tennis shoes, boots, or slippers. Jackets, sweaters or other garments may not be used to cover a dress which is inappropriate. No pierced body parts are to be visible except the ear lobes. No tattoos are to be visible.

(Casual Dances, Promfest) – Dress is a dress, blouse and pants, or blouse and shorts. Blouses or tops must not have an immodest low neckline, visible midriff, or cut outs. Midriff tops, immodest hip hugger pants, immodest hip hugger shorts, or immodest hip hugger skirts are not permitted. Hemlines and slits in dresses or skirts must be no shorter than 4 inches above the knee. Shorts must be of an appropriate length. Girls may wear casual shoes, casual sandals, or tennis shoes. Boots or slippers are not permitted. No pierced body parts are to be visible except the ear lobes. No tattoos are to be visible.

General Rules for Students & Girls

(General) - Deck shoes and topsiders are not allowed. Clothes must be neatly pressed. Thrift shop outfits are not allowed regardless of color. All accessories including shirts and cummerbunds must conform to conventional formal dress specifications. All grooming rules as stated in the student handbook must be followed. Hats (except where specifically specified), bandannas, or headwear of any kind are not permitted. No one may bring props, knapsacks, or bookbags to a dance or event. No video cameras or video equipment will be allowed at dances or Promfest, but they may be used at other events. If anyone, a student, his date, or a girl attending the function leaves a dance or Promfest, then he/she will not be permitted to return. The consumption of any beverage not supplied at the dance or event is not permitted. And of course there is no alcohol allowed on the premises of any dance or event. The administration or faculty of Brother Martin will make all final judgments on the appropriateness of questionable attire. It is your son's responsibility to inform his date of the dress regulations. The dress code is strictly enforced, and regrettably if your son, his date, or a girl attending a dance or event does not adhere to these guidelines, then he/she will not be admitted.
